Dr. Singer has been in the field of Special Education for 20 years. She began as an elementary special education teacher in a DC Public School. She later became a department and Individual Educational Program (IEP) Chairperson. After receiving her masters, she went on to become a Director of Special Education for a charter school also in DC, bringing it in federal and local compliance. Following this, Dr. Singer went on to pursue a doctorate at the University of Virginia, where she studied Special Education, Administration, and the research to practice gap. Within Texas, she served as a regional education specialist, serving the largest region in Texas, and supporting educators with ensuring access and progress in the general education curriculum. Dr. Singer is currently an Assistant Professor & Extension Specialist at Texas A&M University, AgriLife Extension Service where she supports individuals with disabilities and those who support them while encouraging Universal Design for Learning principles.
