Resource Discovery: Sesame Street's New Coming Together Initiative

Recently, Sesame Street launched a new suite of resources developed on racial justice. Sesame Street's new Coming Together initiative focuses on discussions around racism. Sesame Street has introduced two new characters, Wes and his father Elijah, as part of their new "ABC's of Racial Literacy" series.

In one of their introductory videos, Elmo, Wes, and Elijah have a conversation explaining what race is. During the conversation, Elijah tells Elmo,

"The color of our skin is an important part of who we are, but we should all know that it's okay that we all look different in so very many ways."

The free, open-access digital resources are constructed to address racism, racial literacy, and how racism impacts everyone. Sesame Street continues its commitment to a research-based curriculum for strengthening individual, family, and community resilience and empathy. Resources include:

These lessons and resources have been carefully created using a Racial Justice educational framework.
