Risk & Resilience: Understanding Secondary Traumatic Stress Post-Pandemic

The negative impact of traumatic events can extend beyond those who directly experienced the trauma to caregivers who provide services to traumatized individuals, placing them for secondary traumatic stress. The experience of secondary traumatic stress can lead to impairment in social and occupational functioning. In this presentation Dr. Bride will introduce attendees to the concept of secondary traumatic stress, describe the symptoms of secondary traumatic stress, and discuss strategies to minimize the negative impact of secondary traumatic stress.

Brian Bride is Distinguished University Professor in the School of Social Work at Georgia State University. His research and teaching interests are in the areas of behavioral health care, primary and secondary traumatic stress, health services research, HIV/AIDS, and workforce well-being. Dr. Bride is the developer of the Secondary Traumatic Stress Scale and has received a number of honors as a result of his research on secondary traumatic stress. He received his M.S.W. from Florida State University, his M.P.H. from Harvard School of Public Health, and his Ph.D. from the University of Georgia.
