Topics of discussion include the items and services that can be paid for by special needs trusts, the relationship between shelter payments and certain government benefits, and general considerations for selecting an appropriate trustee.



[Can Active-Duty Service Members Apply for SSDI?](#)

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) pays disability benefits to you and certain family members who meet the definition of disability if you worked long enough – and recently enough – under Social Security. The Social Security Act defines disability as a person who cannot work due to a severe medical condition that has lasted, or is expected to last, at least one year or result in death. Or the person's medical condition must prevent him or her from doing substantial gainful employment – must prevent the person from adjusting to other work.

The negative impact of traumatic events can extend beyond those who directly experienced the trauma to caregivers who provide services to traumatized individuals, placing them for secondary traumatic stress. The experience of secondary traumatic stress can lead to impairment in social and occupational functioning. This webinar introduces the concept of secondary traumatic stress, describe the symptoms of secondary traumatic stress, and discuss strategies to minimize the negative impact of secondary traumatic stress.
