Caregivers know those they are caring for the best and closest. Thus, the active involvement of caregivers in prevention, intervention, and treatment is often the key to client success.

The second course in our PSB-CY: Clinical Assessment and Treatment Overview course series delves into the importance of the caregiver as a loving adult in children's lives, especially when conducting clinical assessment, response, and treatment to youth PSB.
