



Why Does Military Spouse Employment Matter?

Spouse Education & Career Opportunities

We know:

- Military families report needing two incomes
- Military spouses who are employed are more likely to:
 - Report excellent family well-being
 - Recommend military service to others
- Families where the military spouse is employed:
 - > Report lower levels of food insecurity
 - More likely to remain in the military



Ensuring military spouses have the tools and resources they need to find meaningful careers is more than the right thing to do ... it is a National Security Imperative

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Barriers to Spouse Employment

Spouse Education & Career Opportunities

- #1 reason for spouse unemployment is frequent relocations due to active-duty military service.
 - A move within the last year more than doubled the odds that a military spouse was unemployed.
- Childcare affordability and availability is a close second.
 - >38% of spouses with children use childcare during day.
- Licensing portability challenges.
 - 31% had to secure a new professional license/ credential to work after last move.



- Relocation must be across state lines

- Up to \$1k to support relocating your small business




